To say that Old Dominion University has changed over the past years would be an understatement. Be ready to be amazed during your next trip to campus. And while you're at it, come prepared to find your way around.

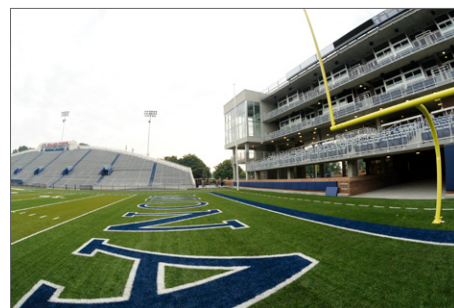
We've hand picked a few hot spots for you to check out during your next visit. Whether you graduated in 2008 or 1968, these are six of the must see changes on campus.*

BARRY M. KORNBLAU ALUMNI CENTER



Old Dominion's first alumni center opened its doors in May of 2004. The facility, which originally housed the Public Safety Office, underwent a major renovation thanks to a significant gift from Richmond businessman and Board of Visitors Member Barry M. Kornblau '71. The Center houses the Office of Alumni Relations and its staff and is your home on campus. Stop in and say, "Hello!"

S.B. BALLARD STADIUM, FOREMAN FIELD & AINSLIE FOOTBALL COMPLEX



Originally built in 1936, with government funds provided during the Great Depression, Foreman Field underwent a \$24.8 million dollar renovation completed in July 2009. Bearing the names of two of ODU football's biggest contributors, the state-of-the-art facility boasts a brand new field surface, scoreboard, sound system, field enclosure and a contiguous parking garage. 26 luxury suites and 390 loge seats offer some of the most modern finishes in college football.

STUDENT RECREATION CENTER



Opened in March 2009, the modern facility sits on the site of the old field house. The center contains 75-plus pieces of exercise equipment ranging from treadmills to weight machines, plus racquetball courts, pool, an Outdoor Adventure Center, a 2 1/2-story-rock climbing wall and more. The addition of an eatery in August gives students and faculty a place to socialize before and after workouts.

KAPLAN ORCHID CONSERVATORY



This \$2.1 million structure with almost 3,000 square feet of greenhouse space houses the orchid collection of late Norfolk physician Arthur Kaplan and wife Phyllis, longtime growers of exquisite orchids. The conservatory opened in April 2008 with over one thousand plants. It is the largest collection of orchids in the area and may well be the only conservatory on a college campus dedicated to the popular plant.

THE QUAD



The Quad, a collection of six new residential buildings—Ireland House, Virginia House, Scotland House, France House, England House and Dominion House— and the adjacent Student Recreation Center, makes ODU a decidedly residential campus. The addition of the new dormitories, along with the University Village Apartments, allow room for approximately 4,600 members of the student body to live on campus.

UNIVERSITY VILLAGE



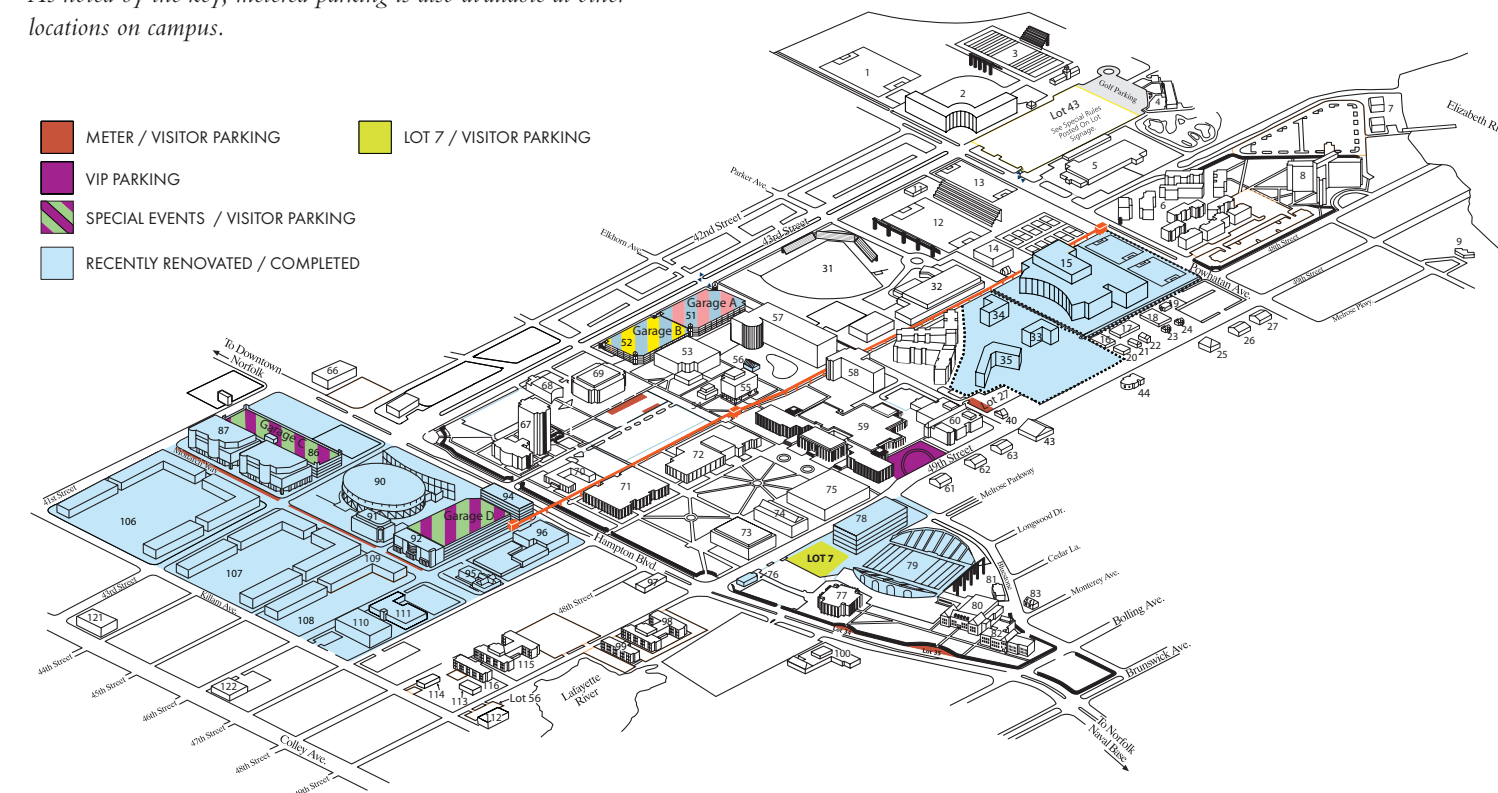
Anchored by the *Ted Constant Convocation Center*, University Village began to take shape in August 2003 when students moved in to the first units of the *University Village Apartments*. Today, the three blocks east of Hampton Blvd. include the *University Village Bookstore*, retail shops, *SpringHill Suites by Marriott* and *The Gordon Art Galleries*. The Village is also the site for *Innovation Research Park*, offering laboratory and office space where researchers and businesses collaborate.

WHERE TO PARK?

Parking is available in the marked locations. Lot 7, directly to the west of The Barry M. Kornblau Alumni Center, offers access controlled parking for all visitors. Thanks to its central location on campus, you can leave your car there and enjoy a walking tour.
